I have your recent letter requesting assistance in locating your sister, who apparently was taken by the Germans to a camp near Munich, and other members of your family who were last known to be in Czechoslovakia.

I regret that the War Refugee Board is not in a position to handle inquiries concerning specific individuals. However, I am informed the member agencies of the Central Location Index are endeavoring to assist persons seeking to learn the whereabouts and welfare of friends and relatives in Europe. I suggest that you present your problem to any one of the agencies named in the enclosed list.

I was referred to you for information. I came to America in 1941 and my parents + 2 sisters and one brother remained in Czechoslovakia and I can't seem to locate them since the end of the European War.

I recently received a letter from an American soldier telling me that he found one of my sisters named Gitel Stern - she is at Feldafing Lager, not far from Munich, Germany. I've tried to contact her thru the Red Cross with no success. This is her last address before she was taken to Germany - 239 Záhata Czechoslovakia where the rest of my family lived at the time I left. Could you try to locate her. I would like to send her anything that she may need.
