Dear Dr. Weiss:

This will acknowledge receipt of your letter of February 24, 1945.

In reply I wish to inform you that the names of Helen and Joseph Forda were transmitted to the U.S. mission in Smitzerland on December 30, 1944, as persons to whom American Consulates abroad are authorized to issue immigration visas. The U.S. mission in Switzerland was requested to transmit this information to the Swiss authorizies for communication to the German Government with a view to insuring that your parents be placed on the list of those eligible for exchange with a view to affording them protection pending their release by Germany.

The Board does not possess information whether your parents have been found in the liberated parts of Hungary, and it is not expected that such information would reach the Board in the near future. Should your parents be found in liberated territory, further consideration of the matter of their immigration to the United States would rest with the Department of State. On the other hand, should your parents be in German-occupied territory, it is hoped that the protective measure referred to shove will result in a certain measure of protection and in their eventual release by German authorities.

I would be very grateful if it would be possible for you to aid my parents to reach America at an early date.

My application for a non-quota immigration visa for my parents was approved by the Justice Department (see enclosed document) and the Department of State (File number: VD 811.111 Torda, Joseph).

The National Refugee Board ,New York informed me that the War Refugee Board of the President has a Rescue Committee that is compiling a list of those people who received this non-quota immigration visa to aid them to reach America as soon as circumstances permit. I would be very grateful if you would include the name of my parents in this list.

My, parents are: Joseph Torda, Born: Dec.10,1874, Budapest, Hungary; Helen Torda, nee Varga, born: March 10,1888, Ersekosanad, Hungary.Last <u>address</u>: Nador-utca 19, Budapest, Hungary (received by Red Cross message mailed from Hungary in July, 1944).

I, Clara Torda Weiss, am an American citizen, a physician and research worker, a member of the staff of the Cornell University Medical College.My husband, Walter Ira Weiss, is an American citizen by birth, a veteran of the present war.

I will be sincerely grateful to you for any assistance you may give my parents in this matter.

Reference is made to your newly executed petition for issuance of immigration visa in behalf of your parents, Joseph and Helen Torda.

The records of this office show that on September 9, 1944, a visa petition, executed by you in behalf of your parents, was approved and forwarded to the Department of State on September 18, 1944, for transmittal to the American Consul nearest to the place of residence of your parents. As the present petition indicates that your parents have not been in the United States subsequently to the approval of the first petition, the authorization appears to be outstanding and action on the new petition is regarded as unnecessary.

The financial evidence submitted has been forwarded to the Department of State.

Dear Mr. Weiss:

Your letter of March 30, 1944, to the President, concerning the possibility of rescuing your vife's parents from Budapest, Hungary, has been referred to me.

Your concern for the safety of your wife's parents meets with the fullest sympathy of the Board. I an sure you will understand, however, that the task of the Board is so great that, of necessity, it cannot deal with problems limited to rescuing any specific individuals. The War Refugee Board is directing unstinted efforts to the solution of the problems precipitated by recent developments, and I assure you that everything in its power will be done to rescue and save the victims of enemy persecution who are in imminent danger of death.

I suggest that you may wish to refer your problem to a private organisation. There is enclosed a list of some of the organisations which I am advised may be in a position to be of some help to you.
