Dear Mrs. Zajderman:

I have your letter of March 11, 1944, seeking the assistance of the War Refugee Board to enable your daughter to come to the United States from Belgium.

I think you will understand that the task of the Board is so great that, of necessity, it cannot deal with problems limited to seeking out and rescuing any specific individuals. We shall, of course, do everything in our power to rescue and save the victims of enemy oppression who are in imminent danger of death.

I suggest that you may wish to refer your problem to a private organization. There is enclosed a list of some of the organizations which I am advised may be in a position to be of help to you.

Dear Mr. Pale, March 11, 1944

I am writing you this letter in hope that you can help me in some way, but first if I tell you my story you may understand me better.

I am a refugee from Belgium in America & 2 yrs I was forced to leave my country and look for refuge in another country. At the time I left, my daughter was in a health camp on April 11, 1940. On May 10<sup>th</sup> the Germans occupied Belgium, we had to leave in 2 days so we had no way in getting in touch with my daughter.

I came to America at last after hard & difficulties and have made my home here. My husband & 7 yr old daughter
