I had been given to understand that such a committee has been act up within the past 3 weeks. But I have not been able to find out the name of the committee or the name of the chair man.

I left Germany in July 1939 for England and I lived there until May 1945. I arrived in USA on the 26th of May 1945 for permanent residence. The last statement of my assets received from the above mentioned banker was dated 11th August 1939, and it shows the inverstments which were still in Germany when I left.

I would very much appreciate as prompt a response as possible and for your convenience I enclose a stamped addressed envelope.
