Dear Miss Hodel:

At the suggestion of Mr. I. Edwin Goldwasser, Treasurer of the American Joint/Distribution Committee, I am writing you the details of a claim against the Bank WUNDER VON WENDLAND & CO., Bamberg, in the hope that you will be able to refer me to the proper committee with whom to file my claim.

I had been given to understand that such a committee has been set up within the past 3 weeks. But I have not been able to find out the name of the committee or the name of the chairman.

I left Germany in July 1939 for England and I lived there until May 1945. I arrived in USA on the 26th of May 1945 for permanent residence. The last statement of my assets received from the above mentioned banker was dated 11th August 1939, and it shows the investments which were still in Germany when I left.

I would very much appreciate as prompt a response as possible and for your convenience I enclose a stamped addressed envelope.
