I suggest that Mr. Early may wish to reply along

the following lines:

"Receipt is acknowledged of your letter of May 17, 1944, concerning a concert which you have dedicated to 'Free Ports for Refugees'.

"Irrespective of the merits of the cause which you are supporting, the use of the President's name as an honorary sponsor would be contrary to his fixed policy never to permit his name to be used under such circumstances."

Dear Mr. Weinstein:

With regard to our conversation of last week, I am sending you some information about the THEATER OF ALL NATIONS, and a list of our sponsors up to date.

The THEATER OF ALL NATIONS is an organization of artists, actors, writers and musicians of all nationalities. It's primary aim is to provide a cultural basis of understanding among the various national groups, through the medium of the drama and the allied arts. The particular emphasis is on the drama, and we hope eventually to have a theater where we will present plays of all countries.

At present we are associated with the Russian War Relief Society, and the Jewish Council of the Russian War Relief. We arrange all their entertainment programs, and present the various skits which they use in their campaigns.

We have presented two evenings of entertainment by artists of different nationalities, and are presenting two more on May 20th at Times Hall, and on June IOth at Town Hall. We are dedicating the Town Hall program to "Free Ports For Refugees". We want very much to present the scene, which Mr. Ira Hirshman has brought back from Palestine, on this program, and would be very grateful if you would send us this, as soon as the dramatization is complete. Mr. William S. Gailmor will probably be the narrator for this program, and will get in touch with you regarding this.
