Saw No Evidence Of Bergsonites' Rescue Work

Ira Hirshman Makes Significant Statement "as a Representative of the American Government"

NEW YORK (JPS).— The American Zionist, Emergency Council released the following statement by Ira Hirschmann, special envoy of the President's War Refugee Board in Istanbul;

"I authorize you to state in my name that as a representative of the American Government I had control over all funds which Mr. Eri Jabotinsky, representative of the Emergency Committee to Save the Jewish People of Europe, received in Constantinople from America, and I say that while I was there I had no evidence whatever that Mr. Jabotinsky — the only one there representing his Committee — saved eyen one European Jew."

Mr. Hirschmann, the Council revealed, made this statement in reply to a specific question as to whether he was in possession of information that would corrosporate a statement in the press that the Committee brought into Palestine 80,000 Jews from the Balkans.
