Ordinarily, payment for such remittances are accepted at the office of the HIAS, 425 Lafayette Street, New York City.

It should be sent to us together with the full name and address of the beneficiary. If the remitter has in her possession an envelope received from the person in the USSR, giving the full name and address in Russia, will you please ask that it be sent along to us so that we could have it copied accurately for the transmission records. We would, of course, return the envelope.
