Re: Meeting with Miles Standish

I think that Standish might be particularly helpful in advising us how to get action out of State Department people in the field. In view of his experience in visa work, both in the Department and in France, he may be helpful in showing us how to shortcut actual visa procedure, etc. He is, of course, a former foreign service officer which, in my mind, always creates a doubt, but he seems quite enthusiastic and for some reason did resign from foreign service. He also seems to have some ideas about getting Latin American countries to admit refugees.
