





Thank you for handling the Cromwell letter request.

I am delighted that your work with the Memorial Committee is settled and I hope you will find it interesting.

Please do not worry about me. I can't imagine where Drew Pearson got the information that I am about to have a nervous breakdown. I have been at every meeting of the UN committees, and kept several evening engagements which I made before I realized how much work the UN would mean. I have had to refuse a great many invitations to speak simply because I didn't have the time. I am really fine, and I have had to learn to say "no" to many people. In one week, we kept a count of the number of requests to speak, to see people, etc., and it was forty-seven!

I am sorry you didn't know that we moved the office down to the apartments. We found we wasted a lot of time in travel, and people were beginning to come in so



Dear Mrs. Roosevelt:-

Your note of January 31st in regard to Missy's papers has come and here is the story.

In packing up the White House files, I put with the President's papers all material in all the files which, in my opinion, could be considered official. All the correspondence which Missy handled, as Private Secretary, is a part of what we called the "central files", and is now in the Hyde Park Library.

I have two crates and a carton of Missy's personal files which Henry Morgenthau allowed me to place in a vault in the Treasury Department. I had a call only a week or ten days ago from a gentleman in the Treasury who said they could use the space which these papers occupied so last week I moved them to my apartment. I hope to have an opportunity to go through these files early next week to see if they contain any official matters. My recollection is that this correspondence is of a purely personal nature -- letters to Missy from her family and intimate friends, and her replies.

After the President's death, I sent to Dan Le Hand, as Executor of Missy's Estate, a batch of letters and memoranda which were her personal property. I talked with Sam Rosenman about these at the time and he advised me to forward them to her brother.

As far as I know, this accounts for all the files and papers, both official and personal.

I have been invited to attend a Foundation meeting in New York on Friday. I hope then we can really get things moving.

I did so enjoy seeing you when you were here and I was so sorry not to be able to come in to Tea on my last visit to N. Y., but I had to check out of the hotel by 5 P.M.


