

Dear Mr. Tuttle:-

That is an extraordinarily interesting reference to Campobello. My recollection is that in 1785 Captain Willian Owen of the Royal Navy, who brought the first settlers to the Island, died and his nephew, David Owen, an Oxford, had not yet come out from England. *Don* The Owens, as you know, exercised full manorial privileges -- baptisms, burials, weddings, etc. This would account for our missionary friend conducting the service and the baptism on the Island. *The absence of an Owen*
