Your kind letter dated July third was safely received this morning. The delay in answering same is due to the fact that business houses on Fifth Avenue have been holiday making, as per the rules of the Association, for the last four days.

It will be a real pleasure for me to help you in the selection of a new wrist watch, and if it meets with your approval, my secretary, who is going to Washington to-morrow, will telephone to you in the afternoon and ask where and when he may submit to you the watches. I trust you will find among them a time piece which will meet with your approval, and hope that it will mark for you many happy hours.

Now, should I not be indiscreet, as you speak of good deeds, perhaps would you render me a great service? My son-in-law, Pierre Louis Claudel, who is a corporal in the 155th Regiment of Artillery and who was stationed in a fort of the Maginot Line close to Strasbourg (under the orders of General Renondeau who was in command of the City of Strasbourg)

has not been heard from since June sixth. My daughter and grand-daughters, who live at St. Jean de Luz, near Biarritz, have been told that a large number of French troops in the Sector of Strasbourg, were taken prisoners about the middle of June. They thought he might be among them. Would it be asking you too much to have ascertained through the American Embassy in Berlin, if he is among the prisoners? An affirmative answer would greatly relieve our minds and especially the anxiety of my daughter, who is expecting shortly an addition to her family.


