Dear Miss Durand:


When I was in Washington the President requested me to take care of Mr. Harold Sinton who is Grace Tulley's brother-in-law. I arranged with Mr. Rasquin to make him a Deputy Collector of Internal Revenue at the entrance salary of \$1800 per year.

As you know, all deputies are appointed at this entrance salary and then are gradually raised up to higher salaries. This is the policy of the department and as I understand it it applied in every case. My advice would be that Mr. Sinton take this appointment immediately. I am able to do this now and as changes take place I know Mr. Rasquin will promote him as rapidly as possible and the whole matter will be solved. Mr. Sinton is one of those cases that it is always hard to solve because his experience is of a general nature and does not fill in anywhere specifically.

I am writing you on this because I mentioned in a letter a few days ago I had this taken care of, to Miss LeHand and I want you to understand just what the situation is.


