My dear Miss LeHand:

I am turning to you in a request that has come to me, feeling very sure that you will be perfectly frank as to whether or not the request should be granted.

Recently, when it was necessary for me to visit the State Printing Bureau in connection with publication of the New York State Electoral College proceedings, my copy was passed upon by Mr. George Schapiro in charge of such work in the State Printing Bureau.

Mr. Schapiro asked me if it would be possible to have The President autograph the 1940 ballot which was used by the Electors and also an autograph showing the signature of the Vice President. He had in his possession the two cards which constituted the ballots used by the Electors last December and while I did not intend that these should be a part of the volume which we are now printing, Mr. Schapiro was desirous of having them as his personal souvenir.

If you see fit to secure these autographs for him and will return them to me, I will, of course, be grateful and I am sure that it will give him pleasure. However, the propriety of granting the request rests with you.
